

California Arbor Week Poster Contest For California Youth Ages 5 to 12



Program Overview



This grant program is designed to fund urban forest projects and to engage new community-based organizations in tree-planting activities within Southern California Edison's service area.

- \$50,000 in grant funding available generously sponsored by Edison International
- 10-20 projects will be funded, with grant amounts of either \$2,500 or \$5,000
- Projects must be completed by May 30, 2025
- Applications Due: Dec. 20, 2024, at 3 p.m.



Eligible Applicants

- Community-based organizations who do tree planting and tree care education or are interested in adding this to their projects/programs.
- Must be a 501(c)(3) or have/find a fiscal sponsor and be in good standing with the CA Attorney General's Office






Eligible Project Locations



- Project(s) must be in Southern California Edison's service area. Check the service area map or your utility bill.
- Eligible Land Types include private property, federally recognized tribal lands, or publicly owned land with the following requirements
 - Events must be free and open to the public
 - For projects on federally recognized tribal lands or publicly owned property applicants must upload a "Permission to Plant Form"



Priority Communities




- Low tree-canopy communities
- Low-income / disadvantaged communities
- Communities impacted by redlining
- Communities impacted by extreme weather or climate events (drought, wildfire, flood, etc.)
- Highly recommends using data mapping tools like <u>Tree Equity Score</u>, <u>California Schoolyard Tree Equity Study Map</u>, and/or <u>CalEnviro</u> <u>Screen</u> and sharing how your tree planting project will serve a community need.

Key Points



- Project(s) must be in Southern California
 Edison Territory. Check Edison's service
 area map or your utility bill.
- Incubator Grant new tree planting groups are welcome!
- We have a grant guide and resources to help awardees!
- Goal is to make trees fun and to Celebrate California Arbor Week



Encouraged Activities



- Planting shade trees and caring for trees in low canopy communities.
- Projects that engage multiple local partners, including but not limited to schools and youth organizations.
- Tree care post planting including ongoing maintenance and watering beyond the grant period to ensure tree survival.
- Tree planting/care events(s) and/or community greening celebration(s) that have an educational component about the benefits of trees and tree care.

Ineligible Activities



- Tree giveaways as the main component of the project
- Planting trees in temporary planter boxes/pots
- Project(s) outside the Southern California Edison
 Service Area
- Planting tree seedlings. Trees are required to be
 5-gallon or 15-gallon container-sized.
- Landscaping projects that increase the urban heat island effect
- Projects that prioritize understory plantings as opposed to tree planting





What Are Your Community's Needs?

Extreme Heat / Low Canopy Neighborhood

Plant large shade trees and vegetation to shade asphalt and cement

Equitable, Healthy Food Access

Plant fruit and nut trees that can be easily accessed and harvested

Air Quality Improvement

Plant large trees that sequester higher amounts of carbon

Community Cohesion

Plant memorial trees and create spaces where community members can heal, gather, and commune with one another comfortably
